

Call for Nominations for the Position of ICRP Vice-Chair

With the [retirement of Donald Cool](#), the position of ICRP Vice-Chair is now vacant.

As part of ongoing efforts to make ICRP more accessible and transparent, last year ICRP rules were amended to ensure that the election of Main Commission members is an open process. This follows similar amendments in recent years establishing open calls for applications for positions in Committees and Task Groups.

Nominations are now being accepted for the position of ICRP Vice-Chair. Nominations must be submitted by **7 May 2023** by email to admin@icrp.org with the subject line “ICRP Vice-Chair Nomination” as a pdf file in English of **not more than six (6) pages**.

Candidates must:

- be under the age of 70 and have served no more than four terms as a member of the Main Commission as of 6 June 2023.
- be eligible to serve as a trustee of ICRP (Charitable Incorporated Organisation 1166304 registered with the Charity Commission for England and Wales).

There is a preference to nominate individuals with experience within ICRP, and to elect individuals to achieve a reasonable gender balance and mix of expertise and experience.

Nominations must include:

1. the nominee’s name, country of residence, affiliation (normally the employer), contact information including e-mail address and, if the nominee is a medical doctor, an indication of such and the relevant area of experience.
2. an indication that the nomination is for the position of ICRP Vice-Chair.
3. a short CV of the nominee including at least a brief employment history, list of relevant major professional accomplishments, publications, and other information describing how they meet the relevant qualifications for the position including requirements of being a charity trustee.
4. the names and contact information, including e-mail addresses, of two nominators.
5. a written statement from the nominee presenting their case for their application for the position of Vice-Chair, not to exceed 1000 words.

Nominations may include a declaration by the nominee of any potential conflicts of interest or loyalty. Such a declaration will be required of the successful candidate.

Any person other than the nominee may be a nominator. Nominees may be contacted for further information. ICRP will keep in confidence the names of nominees and nominators.

On 6 June 2023, the Main Commission will elect an individual from the slate of candidates. Main Commission members who are candidates for the position must be absent from the deliberations and may not vote.

Should a current Main Commission member be elected to the position of Vice-Chair, a second call for nominations to fill the resulting vacancy is envisaged.
