

HANS-GEORG MENZEL



Hans-Georg Menzel received his Diploma in physics from the Technical University of Munich and his Ph.D. in physics from the University of Saarland (Germany). His professional career started in 1970 at the European Joint Research Centre in Ispra (Italy) and continued in 1973 at the German Cancer Research Centre, Heidelberg and in 1977 at the University of Saarland (Germany). Following the work as scientific program manager at the European Commission in Brussels (Belgium) from 1989 to 1999, he became the head of the Radiation Protection Group at CERN, Geneva (Switzerland) until 2009. From 2009 to 2016 he was Honorary staff member of CERN.

His main research activities are in the fields of dosimetry and microdosimetry of high-energy radiation, basic nuclear data and instrumentation for dosimetry and applications in high-LET radiation therapy, radiation protection, medical physics, and radiation biology. His research work has led to 120 publications. He has been teaching at the University of Saarland and as invited professor at the Department of Physics and at the Medical Faculty of the Université Catholique de Louvain (Belgium).

Hans-Georg Menzel has served on numerous international scientific committees of ICRU, ICRP, IAEA National Academy of Science (USA) and the European Commission. He is currently a member of ICRU and of ICRP. From 2007 to 2013 he was the chairman of ICRP Committee 2 and he is member of the Main Commission. In 2010 he was elected chairman of ICRU.
