Objective:

March 11, 2017 marks the beginning of the seventh year since the Great East Japan Earthquake and Fukushima Daiichi nuclear power plant accident took place. Recovery, in terms of infrastructure in areas where people have been living, as well as areas people will soon be able to live, has progressed well. However, for difficult-to-return zones, recovery progress and plans for the future have been limited. The struggles felt in evacuation areas are not well known to the general public, and it has been difficult to share the evacuees' experiences and issues during this time. Furthermore, the plan to build intermediate storage facilities in Ohkuma and Futaba Towns is moving forward, with reconstruction bases to be designated there in five years. It is hard to say that the viewpoints of people living in these places are widely shared across Japan. Japan as a whole not solely Fukushima Prefecture must be prepared to face the long-term consequences of both the difficult-to-return zones and the intermediate storage facilities. This dialogue will be an opportunity for locals to be heard, to voice their difficulties, and to establish a platform for further discussion regarding the kind of future that they desire.
