

Linda Walsh BSc, MSc, PhD, DSc.



I am a specialist in radiation epidemiology and hold a higher doctorate (DSc – based on 50 publications) in radiation epidemiology and a doctorate (PhD) in physics from the University of Manchester, UK. My recent work has included involvement with the World Health Organisations expert group for assessing the radiation cancer risk in Japan after the 2011 nuclear accident at the Fukushima plant. Some highlights of my research include analyses of: data from the Life Span Study cohort of Japanese survivors of the World War II atomic-bomb attacks; the development of epidemiological models for thyroid cancer risk in areas affected by the 1986 Chernobyl accident; and the mortality follow-up of German “Wismut” uranium miners. I am committed to attaining excellence in teaching at the University level and have several hundred hours of lecturing experience.
